Course aims: The main aim of the subject is to provide students with an introduction to the main principles of the law and its role in society, provide an introduction to legal concepts and rules in various legal systems. Students are also provided with procedures involved in introduction, application and enforcement of rules and are encouraged to explore and understand the substantive rules of law. Subject introduces students to the principal historical and valid sources of law, including nature and classification of law and legislation – why legislation is necessary and the legislative process to amend or repeal existing legislation, to change or add to the law, to codify or to consolidate law (examples of use in each case). As a result, students build their knowledge and understanding of the legal system from general perspective, and develop a critical awareness of its structure, personnel and operation.
