Course aims:

Objective of the course in terms of learning outcomes and competences, the aim of the subject is to give students an account of the formation of current economic policy, to point out a broader spectrum of economic problems and possibilities of their solution within macroeconomic and microeconomic economic policy with emphasis on the theoretical background of economic policy as well as on integration and globalization impacts in the formation of practical economic policy.

Learning outcomes of the course unit, the aim of the course is to present economic policy so that the students are able to understand basic economic relations of economic processes and gain not only theoretical orientation but also substantive argumentation in the choice of economic policy concept and orientation of the current economic policy of SR.

Brief outline of the course:

Introduction to economic policy, economic policy as theoretical and practical discipline, subject and objectives of economic policy. The macroeconomic framework of economic policy. Object of economic policy and economic entities in the national economy. Economic policy instruments, economic policy effectiveness assessment. Theoretical sources of economic policy formation, economic and political concepts. Development of practical economic policy - interventionist and neoconservative economic policy, their practical implementation in specific countries. Macroeconomic economic policy, stabilizing economic policy, supply-oriented and demand-driven economic policy. Segments of economic policy - social and employment policies. Structural economic policy. Governance and technical policy, investment, and innovation policy. Competition policy, objectives, and functions. Pro-export policy and its instruments. Integration processes and their importance for economic policy. Forms of economic integration. The EU and its development. The impact of the EU on the economic policy of the Slovak Republic. Coordination of the fiscal policy of the EU countries, including the Slovak Republic. Globalization, its nature, its importance, its risks and its benefits. Economic policy in the conditions of globalization.
